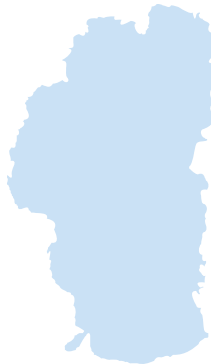
Overview
